The Liberation of the Latin Mass: A Declaration of War on Modernity

Why are the media and certain non-Catholic pressure groups so fixated on Pope Benedict's "liberation" of the traditional Latin Mass? Why have *Newsweek*, *US News and World Report*, *USA Today*, *The LA Times*, *The Washington Post* and dozens of major news organizations front-paged the promulgation of *Summorum Pontificum*? Answer: The world knows what is at stake in the return of the traditional liturgy: a rebirth integral Catholic Faith and its opposition to the spirit of the modern world. *Summorum Pontificum* is nothing short of a declaration of war on modernity. In this lecture, **Father Calvin Goodwin**, a professor at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary of the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter, will explain precisely why this is so, and why we must be ready for fierce opposition, within and without the Church, to a liturgical restoration.

Has the church any other mission but to save souls? Can Pope Benedict find the courage of Pius V and enjoin the heirs of Martel to save Christendom? 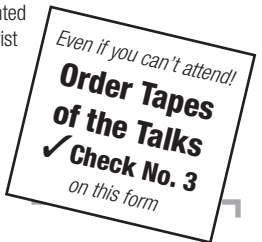
